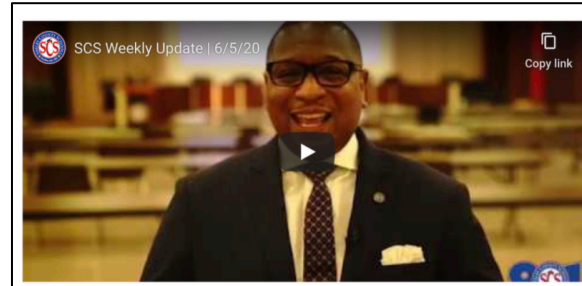

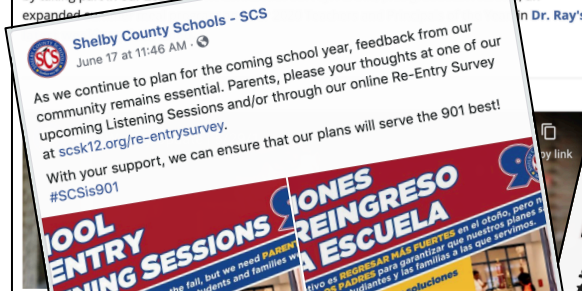

UPDATE (6/5/20): The first week of summer break is behind us, but a safe return to school in the fall remains our top priority moving forward. The District's Re-Entry Task Force held its second meeting to discuss key issues, like recovering lost instruction and the impact of social distancing on transportation and other school operations. We're preparing for a round of community listening sessions to collect more input from families, staff and community members on the reopening of schools. - ▶ **2020-21 SCHOOL RE-ENTRY**
 The District's Re-Entry Task Force held its first meeting this week to begin prioritizing key decisions that must be made for a safe return to school in the fall. The task force will be meeting every week leading up to the start of the new school year to make sure comprehensive contingencies are in place to account for all operational and instructional needs. We look forward to sharing new developments in the weeks ahead.
- ▶ **UPDATED SUMMER MEAL PICK-UP SITES**
 Our wonderful partners at the YMCA are continuing their summer meal distribution at sites across the county. Several sites have changed over the past week, and more may change in the weeks ahead based on demand. 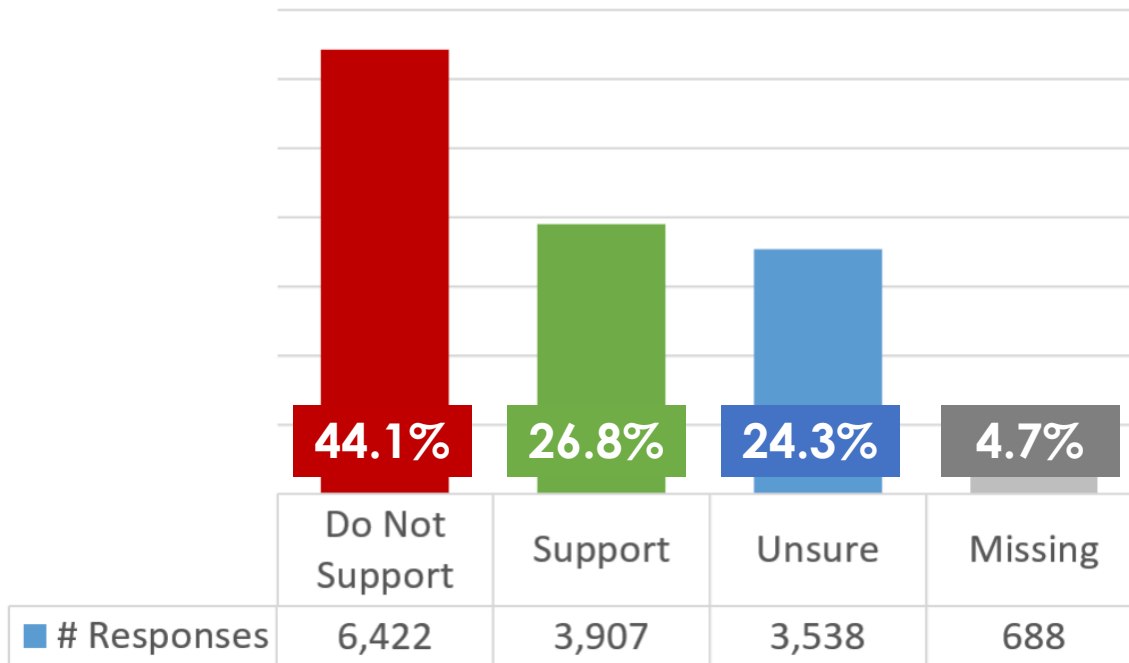

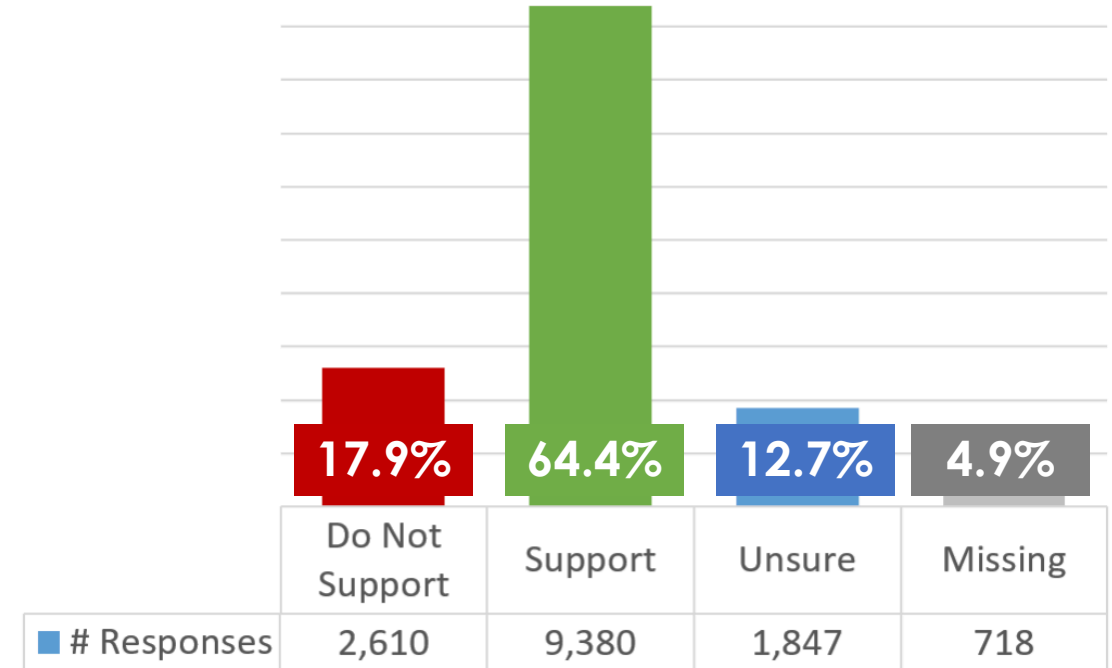

PHYSICAL SCHOOL (IN-PERSON INSTRUCTION)



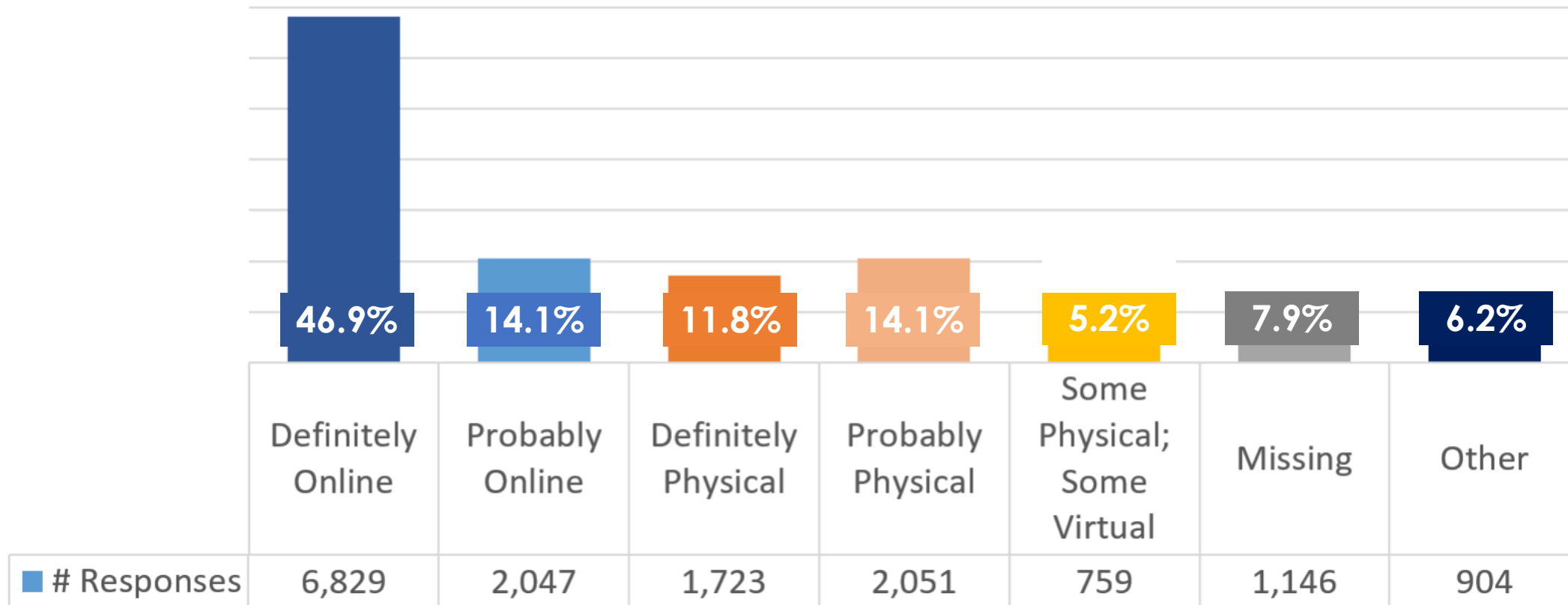
VIRTUAL/ONLINE INSTRUCTION

FACTORS INFLUENCING REOPENING PREFERENCES



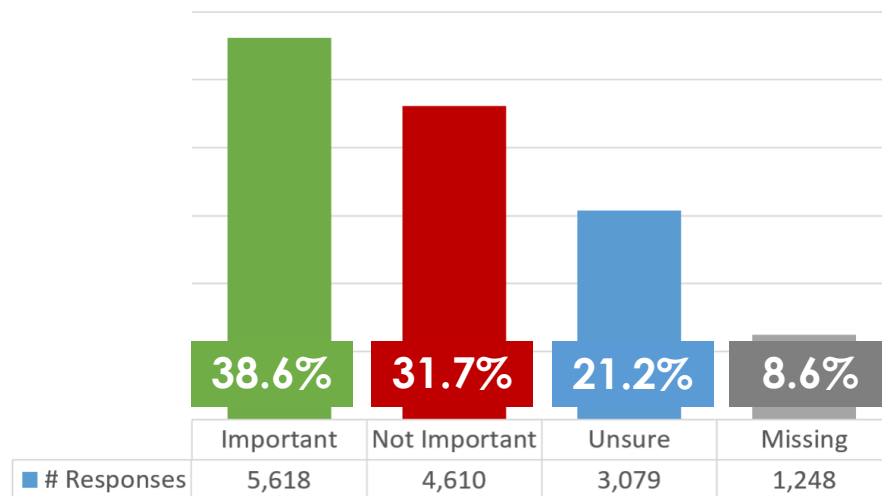

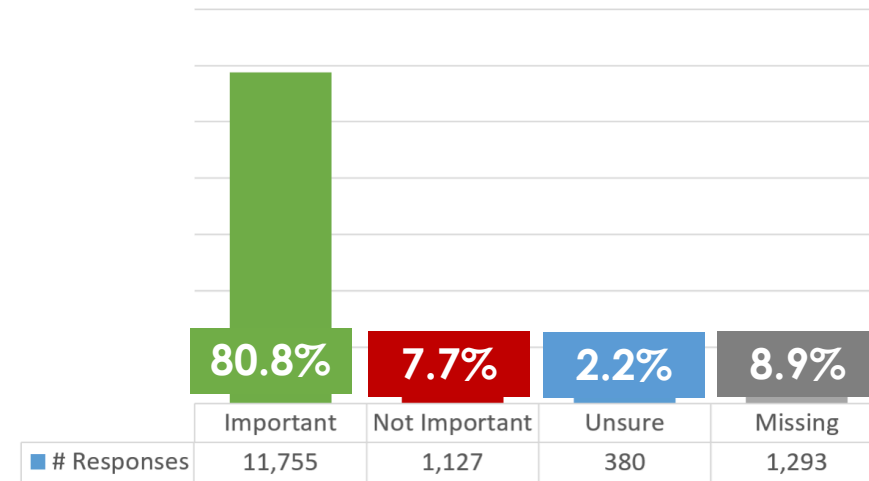
HOW IMPORTANT IS EACH FACTOR?

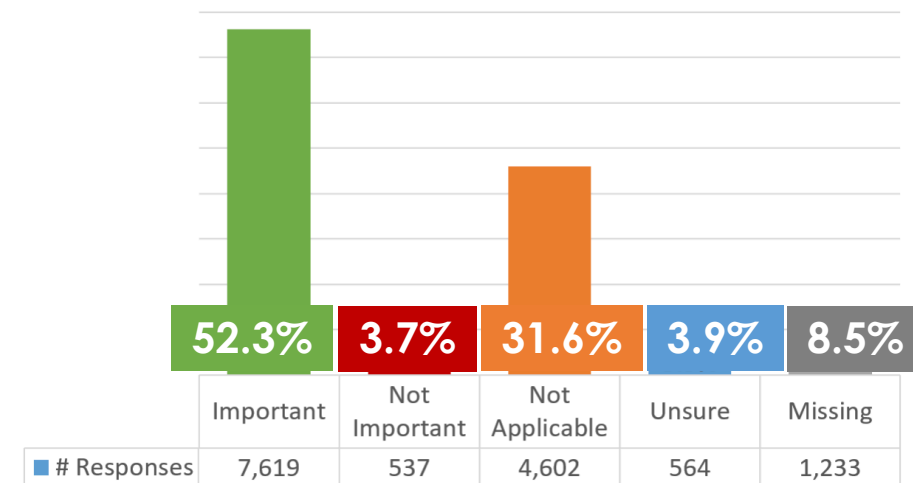

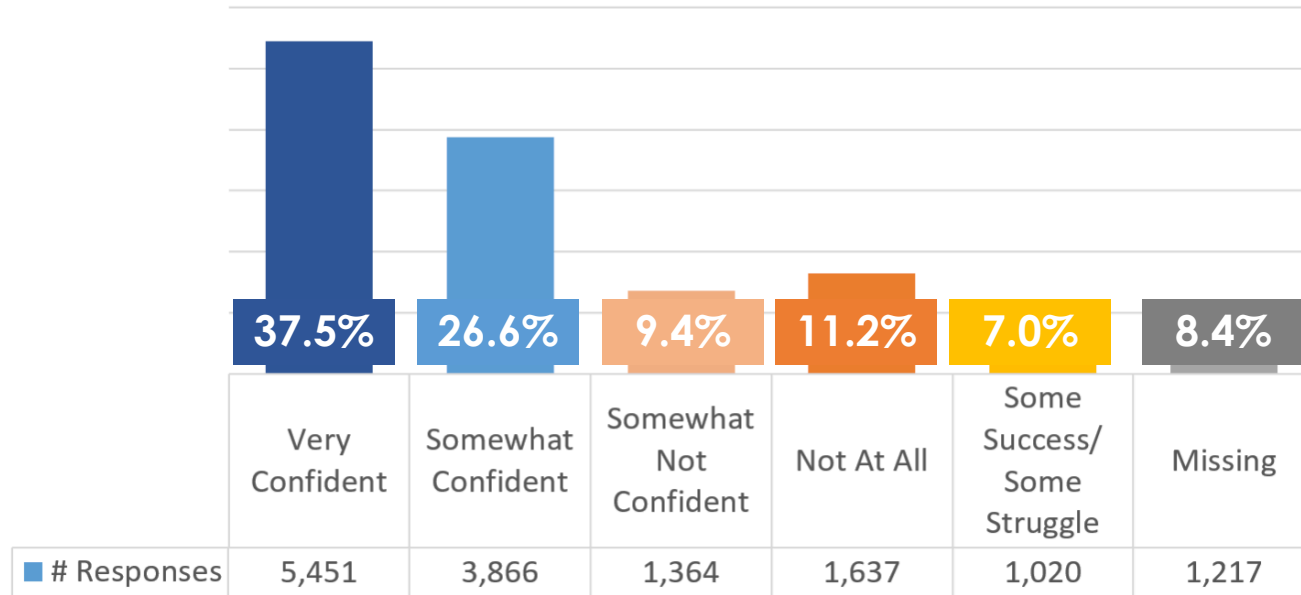

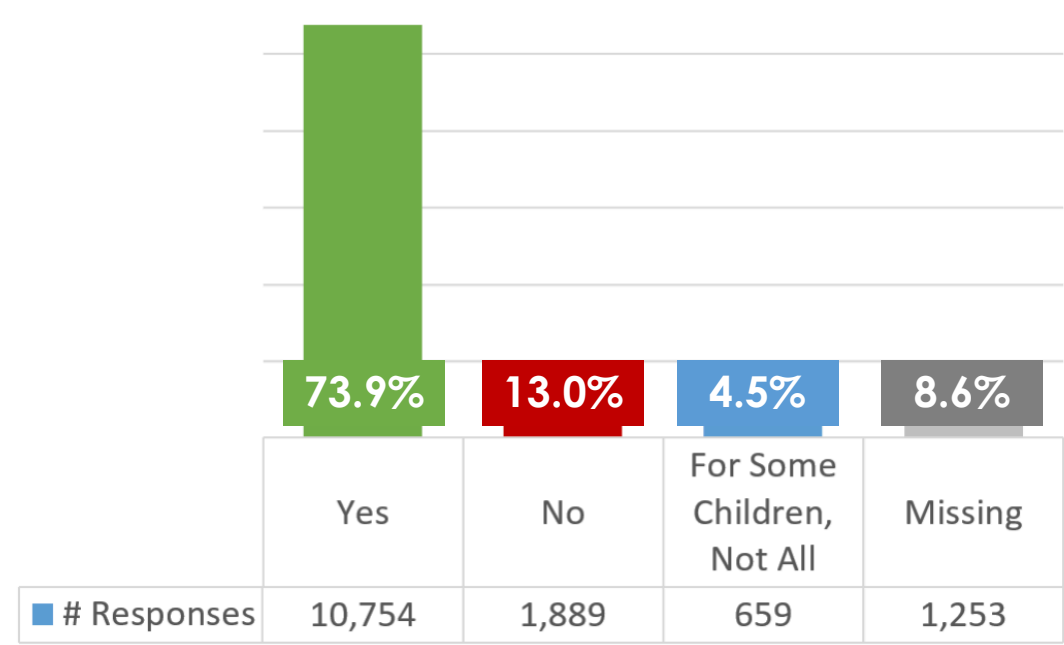

CONFIDENT IN CHILD'S ONLINE LEARNING



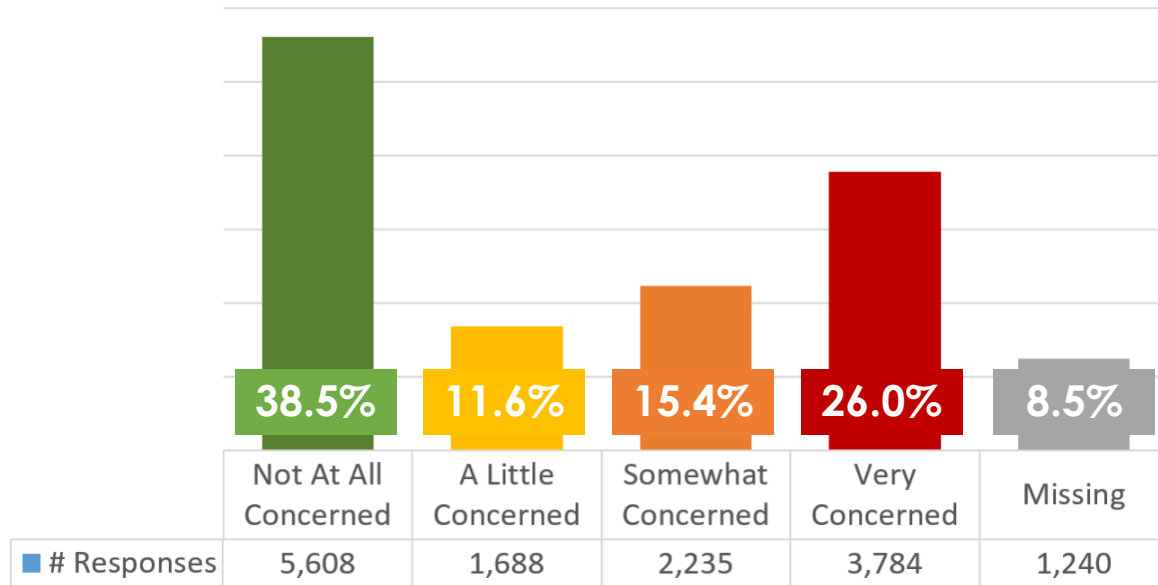

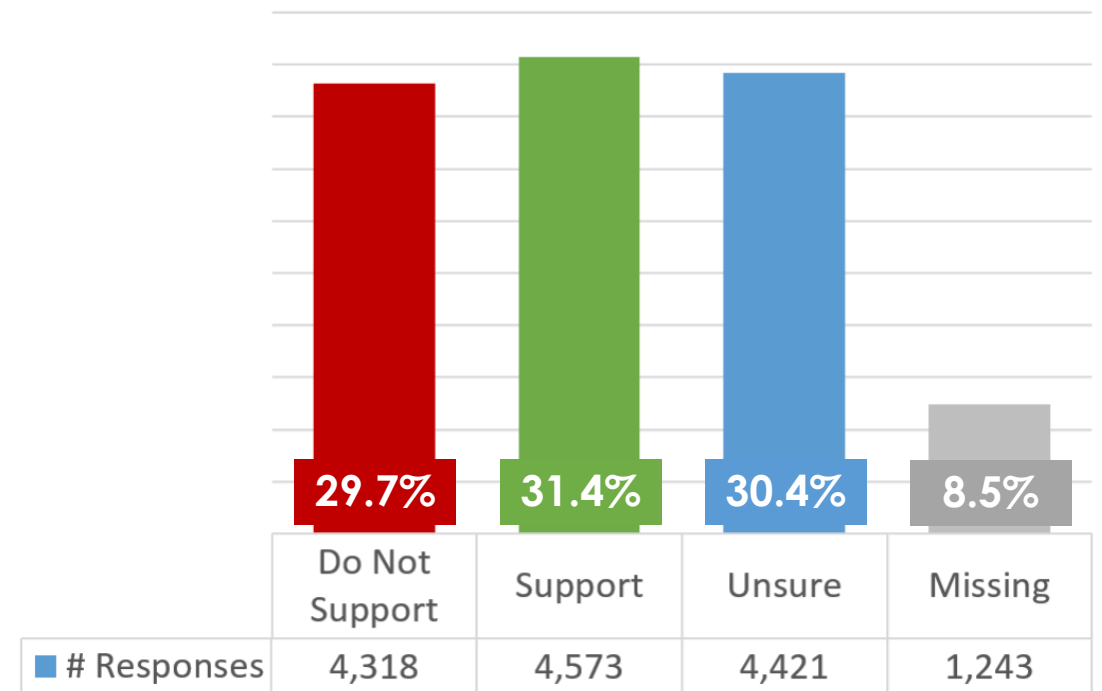

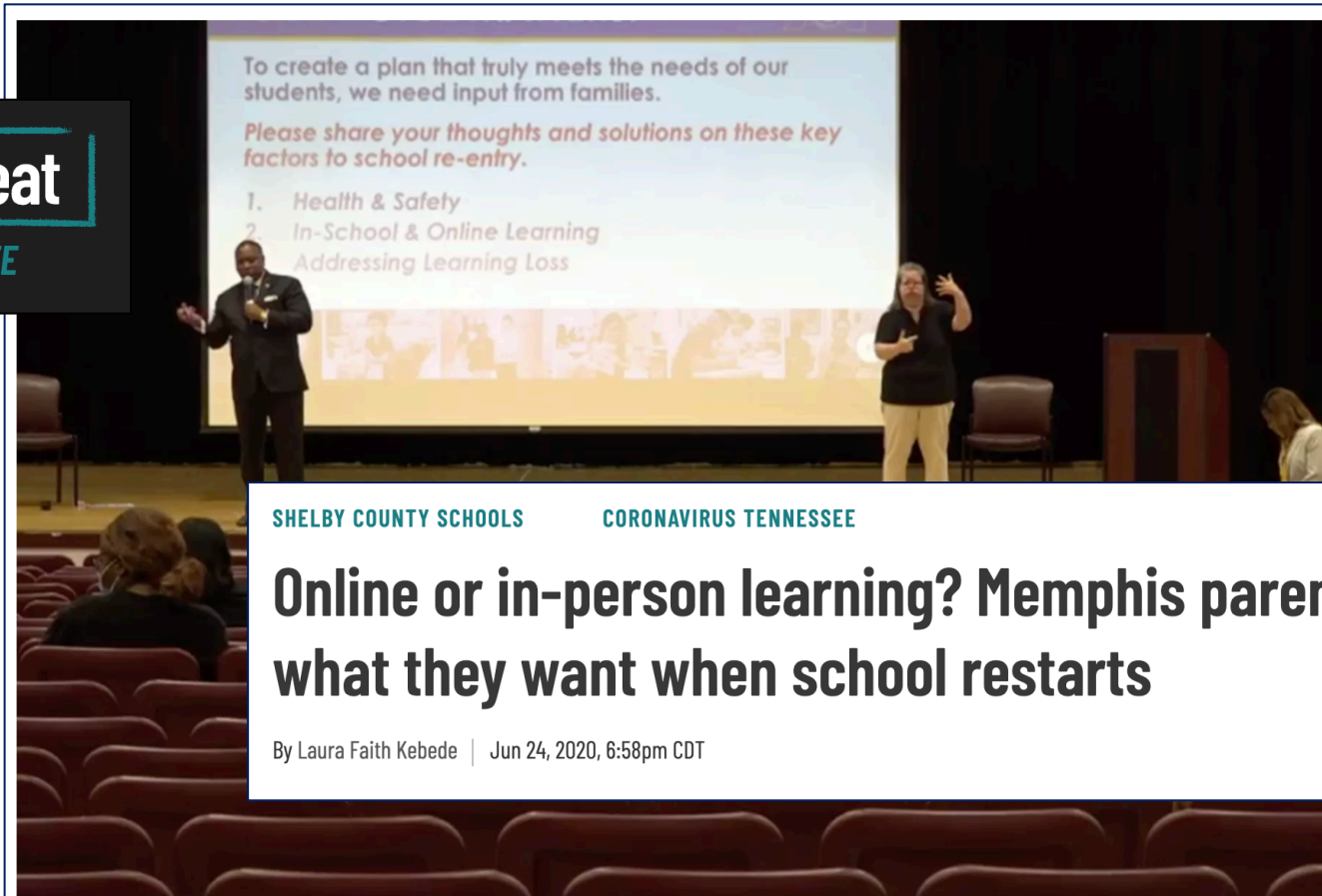
