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

ABOUT MSCS

Memphis-Shelby County Schools (MSCS) is Tennessee's largest public school district and is among the 25 largest public school districts in the United States. Formerly comprised of two smaller districts, Memphis City Schools and Shelby County Schools, MSCS serves over 110,500 students in more than 214 schools. We are the second largest employer in Shelby County with over 13,900 employees, including 6,000 teachers. Through our strategic academic plan, we are committed to working toward three goals: 80 percent of students are college or career ready, 90 percent of seniors graduate on time and 100 percent of graduates will enroll in a post-secondary opportunity. To reach these goals, MSCS has placed a strong emphasis on five high-leverage areas: early literacy, improvement of post-secondary readiness, developing strong teachers, leaders, and support staff, expanding high-quality school options, and working closely with families and community partners to support our schools. PROFESSIONAL LEARNING POLICY 4051

I. PURPOSE

To ensure that employees are offered meaningful elective and required professional learning opportunities that support student success and ensure district accountability

II. SCOPE

This policy applies to all employees.

Annually, all employees are required to successfully complete a formalized professional learning program which may be comprised of specific professional learning activities, hours, credits, courses, or classes etc.

Teachers shall be required to complete a minimum of 64 hours of district—developed and/or approved professional learning hours each year. The district shall provide opportunities such as online professional learning and district designated professional learning days to assist employees in completing their required professional learning.

Registering for courses

- All MSCS employees should use PLZ to register for courses, this includes in-person, virtual and Canvas courses. This catalog includes learning opportunities for all MSCS employees and is organized by department and includes pertinent course information.
- Once in PLZ you can search for courses by clicking the "Courses" tab, located at the top left.
- Next, enter the desired course number or course name found in this catalog in the box located under "Course Search".

Please note, most courses have a cap on the number of participants that can attend. It is important to register promptly in PLZ and verify course date and location prior to attending as courses are subject to change.

Course Outcomes: This session will increase participants' understanding of how exposure to multiple and severe stressors can profoundly affect how children interpret their world. The more ACEs a child has been exposed to, the greater the likelihood that he or she will experience developmental delays and health problems in the future. Increasing the awareness of ACEs in children and looking at students through a trauma-sensitive lens opens an opportunity to approach teaching and learning in new ways.


Step 3: Under **Course Search**, search for a course or section by typing the Course or Section Number in the search box. Once you have entered the number, click **search**.




Step 4: Confirm the correct section of the course you desire to register for. Be sure to check the dates and times.



Step 5: Click **register** for the desired date and time.




Step 6: Review selected course information and confirm registration by clicking **next**.
